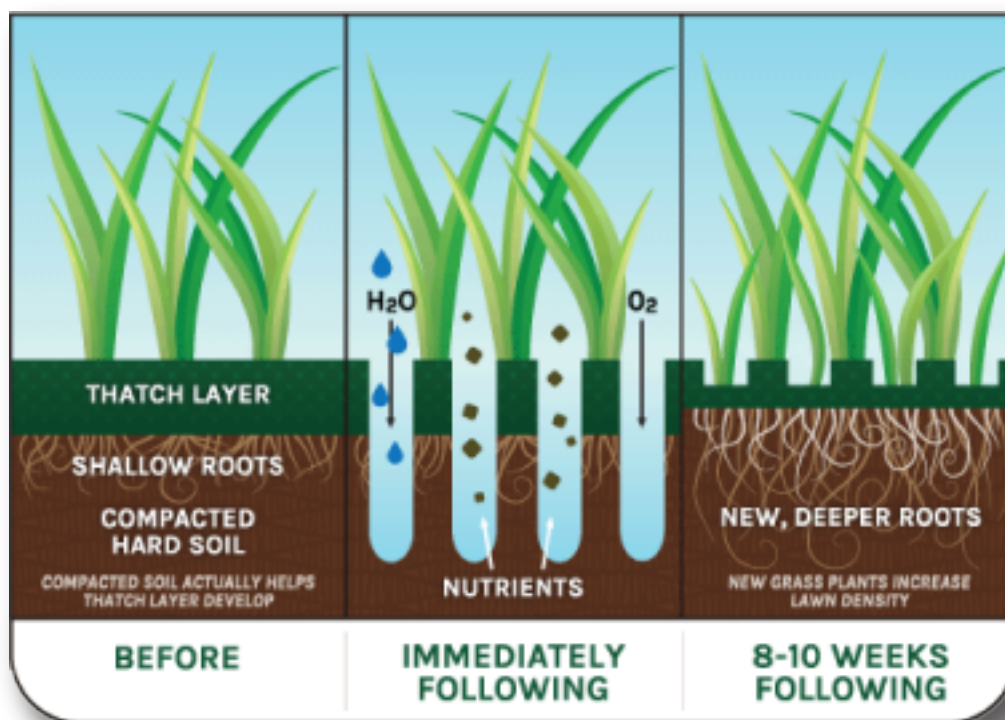
Summary: Lawn Compaction

Over time soil gets compacted from heavy traffic. This compaction prevents air, sunlight, water and nutrients from getting to turf roots where it's needed.

Aeration is important for a healthy lawn because it removes ½-inch diameter plugs of turf and soil, letting the lawn take a nice, deep breath.

Solution: Phosphate Free Lawn Aeration

Aeration punches through the thatch layer (dead grass), which constricts the flow of air, water and nutrients to turf roots (preventing healthy growth). Aeration helps grass grow more deeply, creating an overall stronger turf with more vigorous growth tendencies. **Positive results are noticed usually in 2-4 weeks.**
